All exhibits will be subject to the scrutiny of the Fair Standards Committee, a group of experts who will ensure that quality and authenticity are paramount. The Fair Standards Committee will be headed by **Peter Wain**, the respected expert and dealer in Chinese and Oriental ceramics and works of art.

Exhibits will not be restricted by dateline and are expected to include contemporary and traditional art and sculpture as well as antiques from all disciplines including European and Asian ceramics and glass, clocks, barometers and scientific instruments; modern and antiquarian prints, posters and maps, militaria, decorative antiques, European, Asian and Oriental furniture, metalwork, Oriental carpets and rugs, jewellery, antique lighting, Oriental objects, antiquities and Asian works of art, silver and silver plate, textiles and *objets d'art*.

Both events will be augmented by major loan displays of important works of art together with a number of informative seminar talks presented by invited academics and specialist experts.

Designed for Business

The organisers are keen to stress that major initiatives are in place to encourage exhibitors to take full advantage of the opportunities afforded by both fairs. Both events will benefit from very high quality stand-fitting, décor and presentation. In addition, a major marketing campaign is underway with respective public relations representatives operating in Europe and the UAE.

With a square metre rate held at US\$500 (approximately £250) for each event, the costs of participation will be equal or below those of leading London and US fairs. In addition, Fran Foster has negotiated a 10% reduction on this figure for dealers participating in both events.

Commenting on the launch, **Fran Foster** said: 'The superb exhibition facilities at Abu Dhabi and Dubai will ensure that both these events have immediate status in the region. Furthermore, both events already have the full support of their respective governments. Above all, there is no doubt that both fairs offer exhibitors major opportunities to reach a new and very wealthy international clientele'.
